The Interaction of Art and Sociopolitical Change

Meet One of our Featured Panelists!



The next Mount Holyoke European Alumnae Symposium will be held **in Munich from November 1 to 3**. Spearheaded by the German MHEAC Delegate **Catherine Jourdan '95** and her team, the Munich Symposium will explore the interaction of art and sociopolitical change. Through keynote sessions and interactive discussions, participants will elaborate on how the arts can generate dialogue, raise awareness of issues, and drive change in how we see the world.

Catherine recently had the opportunity to meet Nata Togliatti, one of the featured artists who will be a panelist and discussion group leader at the Symposium.

"I had the opportunity to meet Nata through our Munich-based alumna, Nikola Gossel (MHC '87), who discovered her work some time ago and approached her about speaking at our very own MHC event –thanks, Nikola! Nata has since also met Munich-based alumna Donna Schlimm (MHC '80) and me on several occasions, and we were all fascinated by her work but also her stories and trajectory as an artist. I got to see her present her work at a recent exhibit at the Nymphenburg Castle Porcelain Manufacturing Facility, where she produced various large-format majolica sculptures, porcelain works, and other works of art. I am sure she will make a great contribution to our program, and I look forward to welcoming her to our event in November."



Spotlight on ...

Nata Togliatti

Nata was born in 1989 in the USSR and straddles several cultures. **Globalization, migration, and identity** are recurring themes through which she also processes her own migration experiences, memories, and concerns. In her own words, she sees identity as "a summary of many factors and influences and the human being part of a large natural system where things and living beings are **connected and interwoven**; a cycle, a living ornament where order and chaos exist side by side."

Her artistic practice ranges from painting and sculpture to performative interventions and installations. She challenges established principles of aesthetics and focuses on the **vulnerable**, **ornamental**, **and natural**. Her work is influenced by post-colonial and cosmopolitan approaches with regard to ecological, political, and social challenges of the present. She transforms relics of our everyday (consumer) lives into **new contexts**. Packaging, being the waste of consumer society and global trade, often become protagonists and dialog partners in her paintings. The useless is given meaning, and modern functionalism is questioned. She sees her artistic task as **creating connections**, **overcoming categorizations**, **and allowing the boundaries** to become fluid.





One of the fascinating events Nata has curated is the SUPERMARKT-Frische Lieferung exhibition in Munich in 2021, where she brought **international art onto supermarket shelves** -- remember, museums and everything else was closed during the pandemic, but she made it happen and brought **art to the community**, even in the most challenging of times. Her other exhibits have included the SPEISERAUM 1st Edition-FOOD FOR THOUGHT in 2022 and the second edition of howtosurvivesuperniceandsupersexy magazine, and special exhibitions at Haus der

Kunst in Munich, *KÖNIG Galerie* in Berlin, *Evelyn Drewes Galerie* in Hamburg, *and Canal Street Research* in New York.

Take advantage of the unique opportunity to meet and interact with Nata in Munich, November 1-3, 2024. Registration for the Symposium will open in early July - Keep an eye on your inbox for further direct communication.

April 2024



January 2024








March 2024

The Guilty Can't Say Goodbye

Three women. Three secrets. Three broken lives.

Can we ever escape our past?
When three women move to Portugal and are thrown together by happenstance, little do they know how dramatically their lives are about to change.

Fatima Khan is a Pakistani writer with a gift for languages, a German husband, a ten-year-old daughter, and a determination to escape her mother's clutches. Kate Miller is a driven, nononsense American diplomat who needs to get her way, even as her marriage flounders. Abena Nyator is a warm and kind-hearted Ghanaian entrepreneur consumed with self-doubt.

Each of them looking for a fresh start. Each of them haunted by their past. Each of them burdened by horrendous secrets.

A visit by Fatima's mother threatens to derail her new life and forces her to face her demons. And when all-consuming guilt gets the better of Kate and Abena, each must make a momentous decision. Set against a sweeping international backdrop—Lisbon, Singapore, Karachi, Houston, Copenhagen, Berlin, Dubai, Brighton, and Accra—the three women are forced to confront an inconvenient truth: the guilty can't say goodbye.

March 2024


