## Alumna Spotlight: Ioli Christopoulou '01

A proud Mount Holyoke alumna, class of 2001, with a strong passion for environmental protection!

#### **Ioli Christopoulou '01**

#### Can you tell us a few words about yourself?

A proud Mount Holyoke alumna, class of 2001, with a strong passion for environmental protection! This passion led to the co-founding of <u>The Green Tank</u>, **Greece's first environmental think tank**, which is my main and most exciting endeavour currently!

#### What inspired you to become an environmentalist?

To be honest, I am not exactly sure. I guess I was influenced by my family and my school, since I was about 13 years old or so when I started saying that I would become an environmental lawyer. This is not exactly the path I followed, but at Mount Holyoke I wrote my thesis with late Professor Walter Stewart on international environmental law!

#### How did you break into your field?

It made a difference that I knew what I wanted to do. My compass throughout my career has been "to change the world, to make it more sustainable... it's up to us". It is this determination that change is possible that has guided me every step of the way.

Do you have a particular role model that pushed you/inspired you/or challenged you to conquer your fears?

I was lucky to have had many inspirational figures in my life, including **many strong women.** They have offered a variety of lessons, insights, advice, examples. Some still do! Over time, these have created a beautiful, rich, resourceful basket of knowledge and inspiration from which I often draw.

# What's one challenge you faced over the course of the years and how did you manage to overcome it?

**The moment that I was faced with injustice** from a system that I had trusted stands out. The absence of accountability when that happened was an even more painful shock to me. So, to overcome the challenge, I chose to remain true to my values - they were non-negotiable.

Indeed, as the saying goes, every cloud has a silver lining. That moment became a trigger for change and a step forward, a step for which I feel very happy and proud.

# Did you have a vision of your career when you were at Mount Holyoke? How did that vision change over the years?

Yes, it was **clear from the beginning** that my career would be in environmental policy. And it pretty much remains the same!

#### What is your most fond memory of your time back at Mount Holyoke?

There are many fond memories. I **remember fondly** several of my classes, the hours spent with friends... in the library stacks. Then my mind switches to the hours sorting mail with at the school's post-office and the long chats in the dining halls. Other memories, are from other on-campus activities, mostly to how a group of us persuaded the school to switch to fair trade coffee as well as our late Sunday preparations for the Model United Nations competitions.

#### How did your Mount Holyoke experience contribute to your career aspirations?

When I went back to campus in the fall of 2019, I realized, perhaps, more clearly than ever before, that **Mount Holyoke gave me a very solid foundation on which to build my future**. The experience – in and out of class – fortified me with the assurance that an impactful career is possible.

# What advice would you give to young women today who want to break into this field?

**My advice would be to remain optimistic.** While trends on the state of the environment are more than alarming, we can still reverse them and in fact, I think, that change is already happening.

#### What according to you is the biggest environmental threat today?

The interlinked climate and biodiversity crises, which, if not reversed, will **change our precious planet Earth** forever.

# If there's one thing that everyone could do today to help protect the environment, what would that be?

I don't like to dictate what one must do, as it depends on one's circumstances. One can reduce, reuse and recycle more, another can use the bike, someone else can switch to a vegetarian diet or plant a tree. So I would rather say do what you can; and, if you are in a position to do more, then do so!

# British Club Donation to International Student Scholarship Aid

The donation for international student scholarship resumes a tradition which began in 1987. The first award, originally devised to celebrate Mount Holyoke's 1987 sesquicentennial, enabled a British student, selected by the college, to study in South Hadley for one year. Subsequently, the club continued to build funds from the sale of Halcyon Days enamel boxes, place mats and coasters.

The enamel boxes, which showed different designs of the college, celebrate the history of MHC. Once income reached a threshold of \$5,000, the club sent funds to the college. As of 2013 we had sent eleven scholarships of \$5,000.

The 2021 award is made possible through the generosity of alumnae donations, including one from the Lyndsey Ingram Gallery, and funds raised from events and the 2020 AGM online silent auction.

The recipes are supported by fascinating personal backstories, which allow us to celebrate our international network in a truly unique way. #### Virtual Literary Aperitifs – feeding our minds and souls.

In the latest dark winter period, two virtual literary aperitifs offered alums and students from Europe and beyond a much-needed dose of intellectual stimulation and discussion.

On November 21, French alumna **Patricia Brooks '89**, a Certified Professional Coach, book author and host of the <u>Discovering Courage Podcast</u>, shared her personal story of growth and empowerment with us, offering hope and inspiration to all attendees.

Patricia illustrated how her "Three Catalysts for Cultivating Courage" help women believe in their dreams, build confidence in their abilities, and develop actionable plans to achieve what they once thought impossible and thus feel empowered to tackle their next feat.

Her message was music to all attendees' ears, and the breakout sessions allowed everyone to explore how the tools that help us navigate uncertainty and change can allow us to turn obstacles into opportunities.

On February 20 distinguished poets **Randi Stebbins '95**, Director of the Center for Writing at the University of Iceland, and **Marjory Wentworth '80**, Professor of Literature at the College of Charleston (South Carolina), challenged and engaged us in a unique interactive session focusing on "found poetry". The literary equivalent of a collage, found poetry refashions existing texts, reordering, and presenting the contents as poems. Poems included in this genre are often made from newspaper articles, street signs, graffiti, speeches, letters, or even other poems.

The theme of the session led by Randi and Marjory was "social (in)justice in current events". Following a brief introduction to found poetry, text mapping, and text erasure techniques, all participants were able to focus on creating their own poems, which were subsequently enthusiastically shared with the rest of the attendees.

#### Germany is going digital!

After a brief discussion about the Symposium and College news presented by Gergana Karadzhova '12, the participants opened up for an informal discussion. A second online event took place on 14th April. The Head of the Regional Group "Munich - Bavaria", Nancy Kuehler'65 invited members of the regional group to hang out together and connect. More than 10 alums were able to join, some of them connecting for the first time to the local group, others - reconnecting with dear friends. ## **Great Britain**

The Club wound up 2020 with an innovative Zoom AGM in November. The meeting continued the literary theme, now familiar from previous lunches and aperitifs, by featuring authors Liz Fenwick '85 and Deborah Harkness '86. The two authors talked about their writing partnership, a collaboration which gives them feedback and an objective perspective on their works in progress.

#### Liz Fenwick

The inspiration for Liz's latest book *The Path to the Sea* is a notebook, chock full of recipes for 60s and 70s dinner parties, which she inherited. Exploring tales of the dinner parties led to the question, "what if a child saw something he didn't understand, but it altered his life?" Similarly, Deborah's *All Souls Trilogy*, began with a question, "if there really are witches and vampires, what do they do for a living?" The

answer has led not just to a book trio, but also to a television fantasy series, *A Discovery of Witches*.

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The AGM launched the **club's first online silent auction**, which raised over £800 and allowed the club to make a **£5,000 donation to Mount Holyoke.** AGM attendees voted to donate the funds to International Student Scholarship Aid.
