Dr. Katherine (Katie) McHugh is a staff scientist employed by the Chicago Zoological Society and based at Mote Marine Laboratory as part of the Sarasota Dolphin Research Program (SDRP), a partnership to engage in dolphin research, education, and conservation action. Katie works on research aimed at understanding and mitigating adverse human-dolphin interactions. She is also responsible for overseeing behavioral research, as well as coordinating training programs for undergraduate interns and international trainees.

Sarasota Dolphin Research Project's desire with each research or conservation project in Florida or elsewhere is to contribute to a better understanding of the structure and dynamics of populations of small cetaceans — dolphins, whales, and porpoises — as well as the natural factors and the factors of human origin that impact them. SDRP uses an interdisciplinary and collaborative approach as they conduct studies of bottlenose dolphins within their main study area, Sarasota Bay, a unique. long-term natural laboratory.

Professor Amar is one of Yale's most engaging and dynamic speakers. Akhil Reed Amar is Sterling Professor of Law and Political Science at Yale University, where he teaches constitutional law in both Yale College and Yale Law School. After graduating from Yale College, summa cum laude, in 1980 and from Yale Law School in 1984, and clerking for then Judge (now Justice) Stephen Breyer, Amar joined the Yale faculty in 1985 at the age of 26. He is Yale's only currently active professor to have won the University's unofficial triple crown — the Sterling Chair for scholarship, the DeVane Medal for teaching, and the Lamar Award for alumni service.

OPTIMIZE YOUR VOCAL HEALTH with Stacie Colombo Steinke '82

On February 16, 2022, members of the Mount Holyoke Club of SW FL and guests participated in a lively workshop presented by one of our own, a radiant Stacie Steinke Class of 1982. Maria Mandler '74, Social Chair, hosted the Zoom session. Graduates from the '80s decade exchanged fond greetings online. Stacie mentioned she'd just starred in "Gilligan's Island" in Gulfport, in the role of Marianne. She had two of the best songs!

Elizabeth Russell '70, Club Program Chair, introduced Stacie as a vocal professional who not only performs but also teaches voice and musical arts at her studio, "Body Breath & Soul Vocal Studio," in St. Pete. She received her BA in English from MHC, and Masters of Music in Vocal Pedagogy from Catholic University of America. She also teaches at Shorecrest Prep in St. Pete.

At the time of her move to Florida in 2017, Stacie encountered vocal issues, and learned through yoga that body and breath are the key to vocal health. She explored the movements to help one's sound not only in performances, but also for Zoom calls, speaking engagements, anywhere.

Stacie helped us understand how the body produces sound and what we can do to keep our vocal health as we age. We explored spaces in the body that create sound. We learned exercises based on yoga to fill our lungs to capacity and relax neck muscles. We learned to "speak from the diaphragm" to give us more stamina and more of a sense of presence. Stacie led us through "90 Seconds to Presentation Power," a yoga routine to perform before a speaking engagement. We did make some beautiful noise!
