Rather than wait to fill your Board next spring, we began our work early so prospective candidates could observe Board business as currently conducted. Also there are two vacancies (Membership Chair and Newsletter Editor) which an interested member might choose to fill in this last year of the traditional fifth year of the president, i.e., '18-'23. She could have training under the current Board, or assist us in completing our final year.

"We thank you for your interactions and comments."



The Common Read began in 2000 as part of the College's annual Orientation and is open to the College community, including prospective and current students, faculty, staff and alumnae. The Common Read is chosen by a committee composed of students, faculty, staff, deans, and the owner of the Odyssey Bookshop. It is one component of the college's orientation program. Incoming students receive a copy of the book over the summer along with registration and other 'welcome' materials. 2022's Common Read is *Braiding Sweetgrass* by Robin Wall Kimmerer.



Ms. Kimmerer is a mother, scientist, decorated professor, and enrolled member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation. Drawing on her life as an indigenous scientist, and as a woman, Kimmerer shows how other living beings—asters and goldenrod, strawberries and squash, salamanders, algae, and sweetgrass—offer us gifts and lessons, even if we've forgotten how to hear their voices. We are pleased to welcome alumna **Ana Berrios Schaus '03**. Ana was born in Puerto Rico. Her family moved to Connecticut where she attended high school and joined the Army Officer Candidate School.

Ana entered Mount Holyoke College in 1998, but her studies were interrupted by the 2001 attacks on the World Trade Center. The Army activated her to guard the Quabbin Reservoir near Belchertown, MA. She returned to Mount Holyoke two years later and graduated with the class of 2003.

After graduation, Ana was deployed to Iraq and Guantanamo Bay, Cuba where she worked for the Office of Complex Investigations (Sex Crimes). She is currently on loan from the Army to the Air Force in St. Petersburg, FL and will retire on September 30th of this year.

Ana credits Mount Holyoke College with giving her confidence and strong leadership skills which she used effectively as a military commander of over 200 soldiers, mostly men. She was honored by the Army for her outstanding supervision and guidance.

Ana is married and the mother of two young sons. She enjoys living in Florida and connecting with other MHC alums.

In a few blacks angle left onto N Pineapple Ave which brings you to the Opera House, 1-1/2 blocks on the right. The best place to park is in the public parking garage at 1289 N Palm Ave right behind the Opera House. There may be a fee for parking.

The Tour is \$12 per person. Lunch at Cafe Epicure afterwards is paid individually. Annual Club dues are \$20, and may be paid with your reservation or in person at any of the Club's events. The Florida Gulfcoast Chapter of the International Churchill Society has invited us to an evening of meeting new friends and stimulating intellectual learning. Speaker Justus Doenecke is an American historian, writer, and professor. His 2000 book, <u>Storm on the Horizon: the</u> <u>Challenge to American Intervention, 1939-1941</u>, received the Herbert Hoover Book Award. Doenecke is Professor Emeritus at New College of Florida.</u>

Professor Doenecke graduated magna cum laude from Colgate University with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He earned his Master's degree and Ph.D. in History from Princeton University.

He is the author of more than ten books. He has written about the presidency of James A. Garfield and Chester A. Arthur, the United States' entry into World War I, the New Deal, Franklin D. Roosevelt's foreign policy, World War II, and the Cold War.
